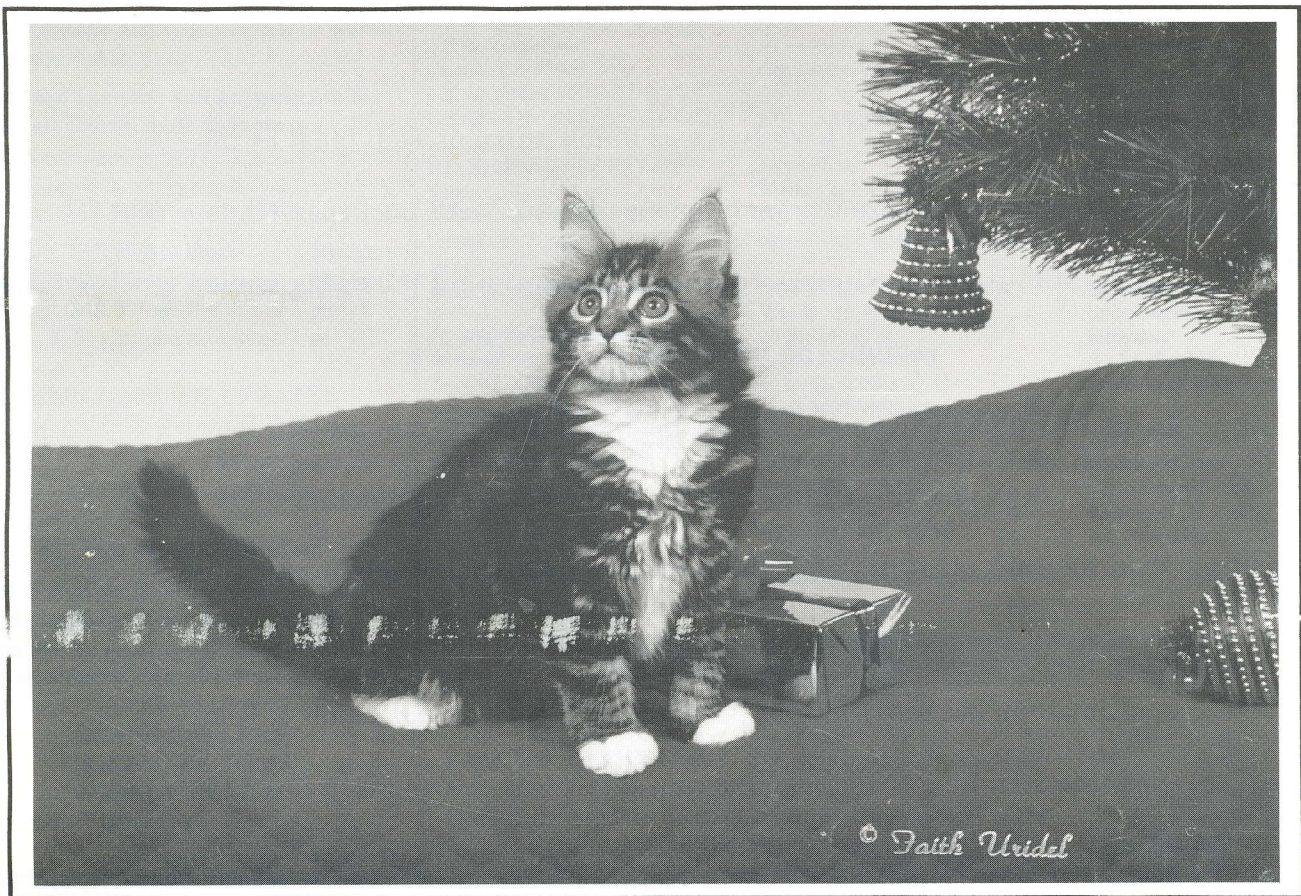

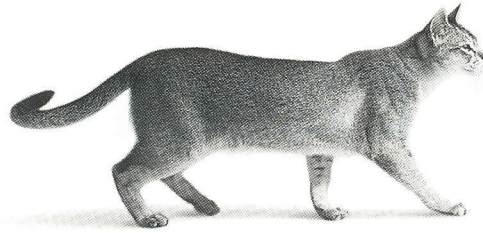

Hip Dysplasia has been a topic of discussion amongst Maine Coon breeders for some time now, and there seems to be an increase in awareness of the issue. This site is not breed specific seeing that there has been findings of HD in the general cat population and not just Maine Coons or purebred cats. We have worked hard on this site to provide the most information on FHD. There are endless sites dealing with canine hip dysplasia, but to find information and research dedicated to our feline friends is hard to find. This site is not pointing fingers or placing blame on anyone, but here to increase the feline community's awareness of the health issue. The site provides information on what FHD is, how it is diagnosed, available methods (OFA and PennHIP), the suspected link between hip dysplasia and medial patellar luxation, ongoing

research (Feline Genome Project, Winn Foundation), articles and abstracts on FHD, information personally provided by the Drs. and researchers of these projects (OFA- Dr. Keller, PennHIP- Drs. Murphy and Smith, Feline Genome Project- Dr. Lyons etc.), X-rays, listing of breeders and supporters of FHDA and testing cat hips, great links to FHD information and more.

This site does not place blame or point fingers at anyone, it simply increases the awareness of FHD. We will continue to work with those who are leading the way in finding the answers to the questions surrounding FHD, and will be updating the web site, as information becomes available. Glossary of Terms

Inbreeding: The mating between animals that are more closely related than the average relationship in the breed. In common usage, inbreeding refers to mating between close relatives, such as father to daughter, brother to sister, and half-brother to half sister. Planned breeding programs often use this strategy of breeding to concentrate desired genes in the breeding stock, and fixes a "type", or "look". It is a process that exposes both the good and bad qualities in the stock. If the strain does carry a mutant, recessive gene (harmful or beneficial), it is more likely to become apparent sooner with inbreeding. The school of thought is that, although this might result in a high rate of defective kittens in the short term, the

negative trait's exposure (and elimination from the program) in the long term is in the best interests of the breed.

Line-breeding: In common usage, matting when there are common ancestors within the first 4 or 5 generations, generally matting less close than inbreeding.

Inbreeding Depression: Loss of vigor due to the homozygosity of an increasing number of genes. The inter-breeding of related cats, generation after generation, increases the probability that the offspring inherits identical genes, over and over again. This may result in an individual with a smaller variety of different genes in it's makeup. This in turn leads to

the immune system becoming less effective. Cats can only produce antibodies with the genes they have, the smaller the number of different genes, the smaller the number of different antibodies produced. The ability of an animal to generate antibodies is drastically reduced if it loses its genetic diversity, in other words, comes from a small gene pool. There may be greater proneness to illness, with longer recovery times. Kittens may be smaller, lethargic, with poor growth, or stillborn. Reproductive performance may be compromised.

Outcross: Mating cats of different bloodlines. Close inbreeding for three or four generations usually leads to fixing of type, after which further improvement becomes more difficult. At this point the vitality of the strain may begin to suffer. There could be increased reproductive problems or a weakened immune system. Many breeders find it wise to bring in new blood. This produces an "outcross litter" and the resulting kittens may show an improvement in health and vigor from the time they are born.

Foundation Cat: A foundation cat is one whose parents, as far as we know, have contributed to the gene pool only through that particular cat. For example, Bridget, parents, unknown x unknown, is a foundation cat. Her parents may have contributed other cats to the gene pool, but are assumed not to have, if there no evidence to the contrary. A "foundation cat" by this definition has a relatively unique combination of genes to offer, relative to other cats of the breed. The foundation cats referred to on this site are those which established the Maine Coon breed before the stud books were closed, as opposed to "new foundation" cats, which are introduced into an already established gene pool. Bringing in new foundation blood is a lengthy and difficult process involving several generations and registries.

Gene: Segment of the DNA, generally a region that codes for a single protein. Genes are carried on chromosomes. Cats normally have 19 pairs of chromosomes.

Locus: A site on a chromosome. Every gene belongs to a locus, but several genes can belong to the same locus.

Allele: A variant of a gene (a particular sequence). If two alleles within a diploid individual are identical by descent (that is, both alleles are direct descendants of a single allele in an ancestor), such alleles are called autozygous. If the alleles are not identical by descent (as far as is known), they are called allozygous.

Genotype: The alleles carried by an individual at a gene. The genetic makeup of the cat.

Phenotype: The outward appearance of the cat, what the cat looks like.

Haploid: Individuals that carry one copy of each gene.

Diploid: Individuals that carry two copies of each gene.

Homozygote: Individual that carries two identical alleles.

Heterozygote: Individual that carries two different alleles.

Homozygous: The two genes in a pair are the same, for example two recessives or two dominants.

Heterozygous: The two genes in a pair are different. For example, one mackerel tabby gene (dominant) and one classic tabby gene (recessive). The individual will display the characteristics of the dominant gene, but can pass on the characteristics of the recessive gene to offspring.

Population: An interbreeding group of organisms; demes - partially isolated subdivisions.

Gene Pool: The collection of alleles available among reproductive members of a population.

Northeast Regional Meeting October 10, 1998

MCBFA members,

The following is a report of our first regional meeting.

Our first regional meeting was held on October 10, 1998 in Brunswick, Maine in conjunction with the United Maine Coon Cat Association (CFF) show. It was well attended, and most divisions of MCBFA were represented. There were also several guests, including four CFF judges: Sue Ford (CFF President), Walter Rudokas, Lois Albert and Phil Albert. Rod Ljostad, one of the founding members of MCBFA and still a current member, was in attendance and gave a brief talk about how MCBFA was founded.

The meeting began with an introduction by Mary Armentrout, President, and a brief statement on the MCBFA Quarterly meeting in Chicago. Various subjects were addressed throughout the evening, including the Complaints Committee, standing rules being out-dated, membership requirements, focus more on health, and preserving and protecting the breed, as opposed to promoting the breed.

Some of the concerns of members are as follows:

- 1- How is MCBFA working to protect the Maine Coon? Discussion followed regarding the Rescue Committee, and also the donation for the Penn Hip study that was recently voted down. The SS will have a question regarding Rescue/ Penn Hip donations in the near future.
- 2- Standing rules being out of date. Mary stated how long it takes for things to happen with the current system in place, and also spoke about the Complaints Committee getting off to a late start. A proposed change is being requested, concerning the Complaints Committee, that will keep things flowing uninterrupted between terms in office.
- 3- Membership issues: The Membership Review Committee was discussed, and how they will be looking at each division within the association, creating/ expanding divisions, evaluating membership requirements, etc.

Other areas of concern were how MCBFA has gotten away from its original purpose. People are more interested in winning in the show ring, and breeding the most/ best cats, as opposed to working with and educating fellow breeders/ exhibitors, protecting the breed, etc. Some members feel that the value of MCBFA is declining. Mary asked for input from members on why they joined MCBFA, and also spoke to non-members on why they hadn't joined MCBFA. Pros included belonging to an association with similar focus and ideals, and also an association to help educate each other and protect the breed. Cons included members not abiding by its own Code of Ethics, breeders focusing on "me" as opposed to the organization as a whole, the Code of Ethics has unfair restrictions (kitten age regarding sales, time allowed between breedings for queens).

Some ideas brought up to help improve MCBFA are as follows:

1. Show positives of breeders and list accordingly, such as testing for HD and HCM, cattery of excellence, etc.
2. Sponsors for Provisional Members should have more involvement/ contact with the applicant, as opposed to being a signature on a form.
3. Establish guidelines for members to follow, as opposed to rules.
4. Open up membership in MCBFA, and eliminate the various divisions. The bottom line among members in attendance was share information and educate. Control less.

The meeting was adjourned at 10pm by Mary Armentrout. The minutes of the meeting were taken by Debbie Crevier, secretary for the UMCCA.

MCBFA Western Regional Meeting held 7 November 1998

The meeting was hosted by Debbie/Al Ordoins (KAHUNACOON) who provided a sumptuous feast of various salads, BBQ'd Chicken and Hamburgers, yum. . . also a "litter box" cake which looked very authentic and not so appealing!

Carole Jo Oberle reported on the RESCUE COMMITTEE's progress. Carole Jo has been involved in Rescuing Maine Coons for quite some time now and was instrumental in rescuing 13 cats from one cattery some time ago; currently she has spent over \$500 of her own money on two other Maine Coon Cats who were recently rescued. Alex de Guzman stated that MCBFA was formed to "protect" the Maine Coon Cat and that should be one of MCBFA's top priorities; if we as members cannot help take care of Maine Coon Cats/kittens who need rescuing; we are not living up to MCBFA's ethics. Those in attendance formulated a proposal to be sent to MCBFA requesting that MCBFA make financial provisions to support the Rescue Committee's necessary medical, surgical and/or expenses for food and supplies and that this proposal be placed on the next MCBFA ballot (details of funding distribution to be worked out by the Rescue Committee after approval of overall Rescue Committee funding).

Other topics discussed by those in attendance were weaning and litter-box training.

Bea Sanderson stated that she gives the Queen goat's milk from the carton (not the canned) and when the kittens are big enough they too get goat's milk, she also recommends to her kitten buyers that they give their kitten goat's milk to drink. Helen Johns stated she had tried "canned" goat's milk and had a problem with kittens getting diarrhea.

Various types of litter were discussed; Al Ordoins stated the "pine pellet" type litter seems to help control odors; Alex de Guzman stated she uses regular clay litter with a little "pine pellet litter" on top to control odor; Don Johns stated he uses ground up zeolite (mineral) in clay litter to control odors; Debbie Ordoins likes clumping litter for her adult cats but doesn't use it for kittens.

Debbie Ordoins is President of TICA Club, Top Cat 'N Tails; she plans to set up a Maine Coon Breed booth at the next Club show.

Our next MCBFA Western Regional meeting will most likely take place sometime in May after the "campaign" >season is over.

Meanwhile the Maine Coon rises to one of the most popular purbreed cats in europe, which finds favour with breeders and lovers equally.
It's well founded by the well balanced character, the well pronounced social behaviour and the feral natural beauty of this breed.

Highest time to represent this breed in germany with a suitable community of breeders and lovers, who work together with other clubs and associations.

The IG was founded in July '98, and we thought about a draft which helps the breed, the breeders and lovers in the same way. It's not our aim to create the typical club but a group which works together for the protection the purity and the preservation of the naturallness of the Maine Coon Cat.

The members confer among themselves and give advice with problems of every kind. Members of any clubs and Organizations are welcome in the IG, we think the belonging to different kinds of clubs and associations shouldn't be a problem to work for one aim.

On the first member meeting that was held on the 24th of october, all members decided to work together in a fair, friendly and comeradly way, always to keep the respect for each other with the exclusion of personal differences and with openness and loyalty as an assumption for the the common work in this group.

Furthermore we plan (a few points have been already realized):

1. Articles in cat related magazines about genetics, medical care (alternative medical methods), behavioural research and about healthy nutrition.
2. Building up a kitten mediation
3. Create our own magazine (4 times per year), with the possibility for all members to introduce themselves and to write articles.
4. Meetings with vets, judges and nutrition experts, as training
5. Organisation of Maine Coon special shows in cooperation with different clubs
6. Articles in the MCBFA Scratch Sheet about the german Maine Coon scene
7. Build an Internet homepage, with topical contents, informations, articles and hints.
(available at <http://www.maine-coon.com>)
8. Possibility for all members to introduce themselves on the homepage.
9. Build a mailinglist for all who have an internet connection already.

Meanwhile more than 50 members joined the IG and we have organized our first Maine Coon special show in cooperation with a German cat club. It was a good success nearly 70 Maine Coons were registered although it could have been easily 140. Unfortunately the president of this club didn't expect this rush and he had to call off more than 70 Maine Coons. The next year's show which will be held with the 1. ITAVC e.V, will take place under the motto „Thanksgiving“ and is planned for more than 100 Maine Coons.

The organization of shows, is only one part of our projects we plan for the future, we try to ask every member to take part in these projects in which themes should be investigated by small groups in cooperation with specialists, for later publication in the IG magazine or other cat-related magazines.

We think that public spirit is the best tool to carry through the interests of our beloved Maine Coon, most of all, if different people, communities, associations and clubs work hand in hand.

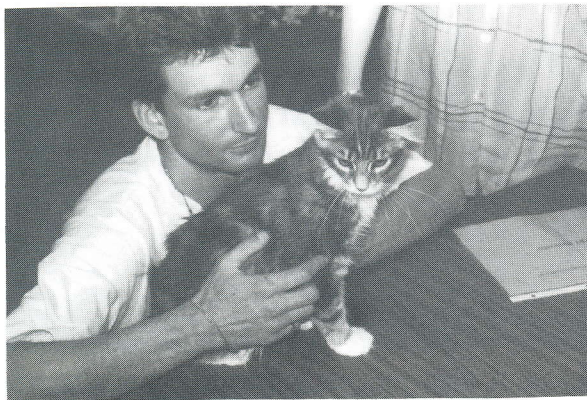

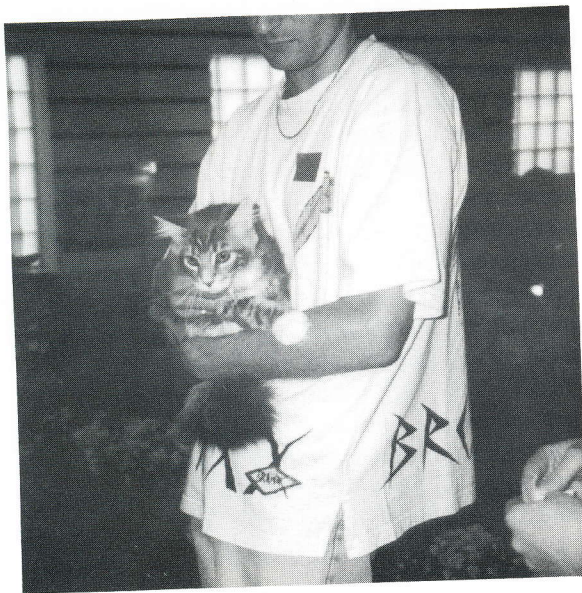

Now that I have been involved with Maine Coon's and breeding and showing them for several years, I can tell all of you how much the experience has **changed my life and changed** the lives of so many people around me. The first time I ever went to my mentor's home and saw her cats and saw how wonderful the breed was, I knew breeding and showing Maine Coon's was what I wanted to do. I was at a time in my life where either I needed to get a fulfilling career or a fulfilling hobby. Most of my adult life had been centered around my children and they were growing up quickly. Boy, was I in for a battle with my husband. Now, when I look back, I have to laugh because I had to be very persistent to get him to allow me to have even more than one pet, let alone a cattery. I just kept sneaking them in, and he inevitably fell in love with every one of them. He just could not understand why I wanted to rebel and do this for the rest of my life. The worst part was that he had to stay home and "baby-sit" his children while I went to the shows. Babysitting was not something he was accustomed to.

Funny how lives and things change. It has been over 5 years now since I have been breeding and showing my Maine Coon cats and my husband is more than supportive. It happened gradually, but the cats actually did it themselves.

He is not the breeder, I am, you will never see him in a show hall, he gets too bored, but he has an opinion about every cat we own and when a person that has never met us comes around, the first thing he says is "ever heard of a Maine Coon cat, boy are they special, my wife is a breeder" and of course he gives them a grand tour and introduces them to every cat in the house. I think he would rather show off all of the cats then I would, I still worry what people might say because we have more than the average person, well he's not worried a bit. Sometimes he'll make a comment that you cannot help but laugh at, like "how many men do you know that have to sleep with 5 kittens and a mother cat just to sleep with their wife". If he comments that we have too many cats, which is rare anymore, I usually agree and mention placing one or two. That's where he really throws me, any cat I mention placing he usually fights me on and says "no, not that one, she is my favorite, she is never leaving here". It's usually 1, who has the better judgment and can make the ultimate decision to place one of them, and it's usually when he is just not at home that the arrangements are made.

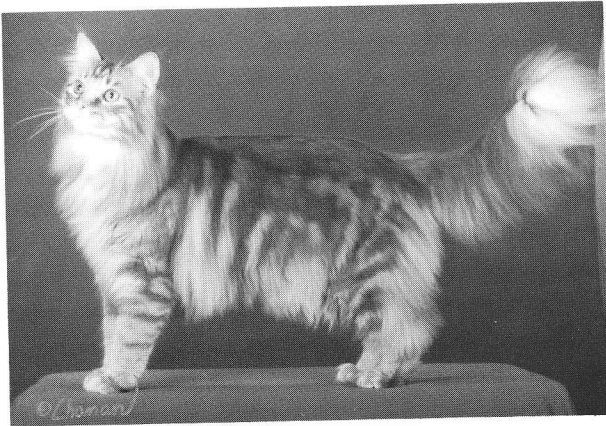

My side of the family, being cat lovers anyway, and once introduced to their first Maine Coon cat, was easily persuaded. Besides, now they all have the wonderful opportunity to own one of my precious cats. Believe me, convincing my husband's side of the family (never really having been around cats much) was a little more of a challenge. Whenever we would get a visit, I would be a nervous wreck trying to make sure there were no "bad smells" or "kittens into mischief. Fortunately for me though, it was out of my hands, the cats and kittens won their hearts too and now they all look forward to a visit at our house. Sometimes I wonder whether they enjoy us or the cats and kittens more. My house seems to be the house all the cousins and grandchildren want to visit, of course, we all know why!!!! I have to laugh deep down inside because these were the actual family members that supported my husband and really needed the convincing. I feel so incredibly lucky that I am a part of the Maine Coon cat community. I have made so many new friends and met so many wonderful people. Sometimes, when I hear a complaint from the kids or my husband, I retort "okay, maybe I'll just quit", just to get a reaction, and the reaction is usually what I think it will be "What, don't do that." Sometimes my husband and I laugh together, "boy if we had known about raising Maine Coon kittens before we had kids!!!" You know the rest. Anyway, for all of you new exhibitors and breeders that have a problem with your husbands or families accepting what you want to do, all I have to say is "its only a matter of time, they'll be on your side, it's inevitable".



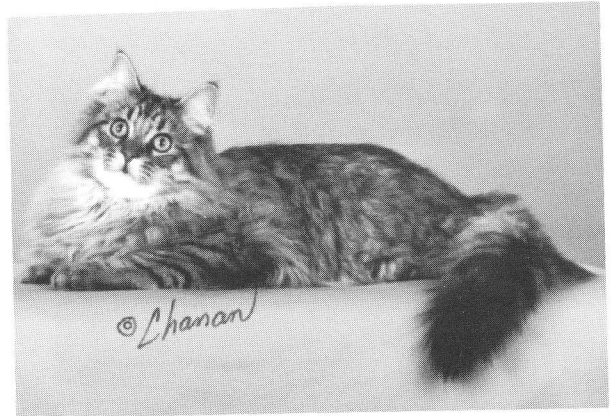
